Section 1: Art Projects

Paper Plate Carrot Garden | HF

Materials needed:

1. Paper Plate
2. Green Construction Paper
1. Orange Construction Paper
2. Brown Tissue Paper
3. Brown Construction Paper
4. Glue
5. Scissors
1. Stapler
2. Pencil or Pen

Instructions:

1. First cut your paper plate in half. Straight up the center to make TWO equal halves. Save one half of the paper plate for today's craft and the other for a rainy day!
1. Grab your brown tissue paper and cut/tear a small amount into small pieces to represent the dirt. Glue those pieces to the paper plate half.
1. Trace one of your hands on the orange construction paper. Use the scissors to trim around/out the traced handprint design from the paper.
1. Cut out small greenery from green paper for EACH fingertip of the handprint. This will give the look of carrots! Glue or staple those on to each fingertip.
1. Staple or glue the decorated orange handprint to the paper plate.
1. If desired – cut out a simple worm from light brown cardstock paper to add to the paper plate piece.



Earth Paper Plate Project | HF | LF

Materials needed:

1. Paper Plates
1. Blue Paint
2. Green Tissue Paper
3. White Construction Paper
4. Black Marker
5. Googly Eyes
1. Scissors
2. Glue

Instructions:

1. Paint paper plate blue
1. Cut pieces of green paper and glue to paper plate.
1. Glue googly eyes to the plate and draw a mouth and any other facial features you may want with a marker.
1. Cut 4 strips of white paper. I cut 2 longer and wider for the legs. Accordion fold the strips of paper and glue or tape to the back of the paper plate so that your earth has arms and legs.



Clay Impressions | HF

Materials needed:

1. Clay
2. Flowers/Plants
3. Rolling Pin
4. Paint



Instructions:

1. Use rolling pin to roll clay into a flat oval shape
1. Next, place plant or flower on the center of your flattened clay
1. Use rolling pin again to flatten the plant/flower onto the clay and make the impression.
1. Carefully remove the plant/flower
1. Use paint to color in the impression if desired.
1. Optional: Now you may also use a stick or chopstick to make a hole at the top of your clay to run a piece of string or ribbon through to hang it

Spring Seed Bombs | HF | LF

Materials needed:

1. 3-4 Packages of Flower Seeds
2. Food Processor
3. Scissors
4. Water
1. 3 Small Containers
2. Baking Sheet and Parchment Paper
3. 3 Sheets of Construction Paper (Blue, Green, White)

Instructions:

1. Start by cutting your construction paper into one-inch squares. Place each color separately in a container.
1. Once you have cut up all your paper squares and each container is ready, add water. Cover the paper completely and allow to soak for 20 minutes.
1. When the 20 minutes is finished (the hardest part is always waiting), take one container and squeeze the excess water out of the paper. Place the paper in a food processor and pulse until the paper becomes pulp!
1. Place the pulp back into its container. Go ahead and repeat with the next two colors until you have three containers of pulp!
1. Divide the packages of seeds between the three containers gently mixing them into the pulp.
1. Start by taking a bit of each color from each container and forming it into a ball! We wanted these to resemble the Earth for Earth Day. If you have chosen other colors that are great too! To make the Earth try not to mix up the colors too much.
1. Place your homemade seed bombs on a parchment lined baking tray. You can go ahead and press a few more seeds into the balls if you think they need a few more. Let your tray dry overnight.
1. Once dry, toss your flower seed bombs into your favorite flowerpot or garden plot.



Earth Windsock | LF | HF

Materials needed:

1. blue cardstock (we used 65 lb.)
2. green and blue tissue paper
3. green acrylic paint
4. clothespin
1. large pom-pom
2. paper plate
3. green cardstock paper
4. scissors
5. glue stick
1. stapler

Instructions:

1. Open a clothespin and close it around a large craft pom-pom. This will be the paintbrush you use for making their craft.
1. Pour a small amount of green paint on a paper plate. Dip the end of the pom-pom into the green paint and then press it onto a sheet of blue cardstock to start creating the land masses on your Earth.
1. Continue dipping the pom-pom into the green paint and then stamping it all over the blue cardstock to make each of Earth's continents on your blue cardstock paper. Let your paint dry completely before moving onto the next step.
1. When your green paint has finished drying, turn your windsock over so the painted continents on the Earth are facing down. Cut out three pieces of 18-inch green tissue paper and three pieces of 18-inch blue tissue paper. Glue them on the bottom one-third of the blue cardstock.
1. Bend your Earth Day windsock into a circle, connecting the ends together. Place two staples at the top and bottom of the windsock to join the ends together.
1. Cut a green paper strip handle that is 1-inch by 8 1/2-inches. Add a generous amount of extra strength glue stick on each end of the paper strip and attach it inside the top of the windsock for a handle.



Q Tip Daisies | LF | HF

Materials needed:

1. Q Tips
2. Green Pipe Cleaners
1. Yellow Playdough
2. Blue Construction Paper

Instructions:

1. Start by cutting a handful of Q Tips in half
1. Roll a chunk of yellow playdough into a ball with your hands. Then flatten it slightly between your palms.
1. Press the Q Tip halves into the playdough around the outside to form the petals
1. Poke a green pipe cleaner into the playdough to form the stem
1. Glue another piece of folded pipe cleaner onto the stem to make a leaf.
1. Now you may choose to glue your flower down on some blue paper or keep it loose and put it into a vase.



Toilet Paper Roll Frog | LF | HF

Materials needed:

1. Toilet Paper Rolls
2. White Paper
3. Black Paper
4. Black Marker
5. Paint
1. Scissors
2. Glue

Instructions:

1. Paint the toilet paper roll green and add eyes with black and white cardstock.
1. Draw on a smiley face with a black marker
1. Make two legs with extra toilet paper roll loops. Add a tongue from another piece of toilet paper roll cut out and painted pink
1. Add feet from other pieces of toilet paper roll painted green



Paper Plate Lady Bug | LF

Materials needed:

1. Paper Plates
2. Red Paint
3. Black Construction Paper
1. Googly Eyes
2. Hole Punch
3. Glue

Instructions:

1. Start by painting the backside of a paper plate red
2. While the plate is drying cut out a black strip for the line on the back, a half circle or half oval shape for the head, a thin V shape for the antenna and punch out circles for the spots.
3. When the plate is dry, glue on all the things you cut out and add googly eyes.



Flower Pot Craft HF | LF

Materials needed:

1. Construction Paper
1. Scissors
2. Glue
3. Tissue Paper
4. Paint or Markers
5. Cupcake Liners

Instructions:

1. Start out by painting or drawing the outline of your pot on a piece of construction paper.
1. Cut or rip various colors of tissue paper into one inch pieces and glue them inside of your pot outline.
1. Use paint or marker to make green stems coming out of the pot.
1. Decorate and color about 5-7 inside of cupcake liners. These will be your flowers.
1. Glue them at the end of the stems



Newspaper Flowers | LF

Materials needed:

1. Newspaper
2. Bottle Caps
3. Paint
4. Scissors
5. Glue
1. Construction Paper

Instructions:

1. Cut petals out of your newspaper. You'll need 5 petals for each flower. Lay down a line of glue and arrange them so they overlap just a little bit.
1. Paint the inside of your bottle caps whatever colors you would like.
1. Glue your bottle cap in the center of your flower.
1. Cut strips of green paper for the stems and glue in place. With a slight wave, cut more of the green paper for the grass.



Blue and Green Slime | HF

Materials needed:

1. 2 cup hot water
2. 1 tsp borax
3. ½ cup water, room temperature
4. (2) 5 oz bottle of clear glue - Elmer's works best
5. Blue glitter
1. Green glitter
2. 2 plastic containers for mixing
3. 1 slime container for storing

Instructions:

1. Pour 1 cup hot water into a container. Add ½ tsp borax and mix well.
1. Pour 1 cup hot water into a container. Add ½ tsp borax and mix well.
1. Add in the blue glitter. Stir it all together slowly, but thoroughly. (If you want crystal clear slime - skip the glitter and add ins!)
1. Pour the glue mixture into the hot water and borax mix. Let it sit for 20-30 seconds.
1. The slime will start to form pretty fast in the hot water. Pull it out and put it in your empty bowl. It will be pretty sticky at this point. That's ok!
1. Knead it for a few minutes and it will thicken and set.
1. Repeat the process, except this time add green glitter instead. Have fun swirling your blue and green slime!
1. Store in an airtight container.



Egg Carton Tree | LF

Materials needed:

1. Egg Carton
2. Scissors
3. Glue
4. Paint
5. White Paper or Canvas

Instructions:

1. Using your scissors, go ahead and trim out each individual section of the egg carton.
1. Paint the egg carton pieces green.
1. Paint the trunk of the tree on the canvas.
1. Glue the green egg carton pieces to the canvas, to make it look like a tree.
1. Now you may choose to add to your tree. You can paint or cut out birds or apples to add to it!



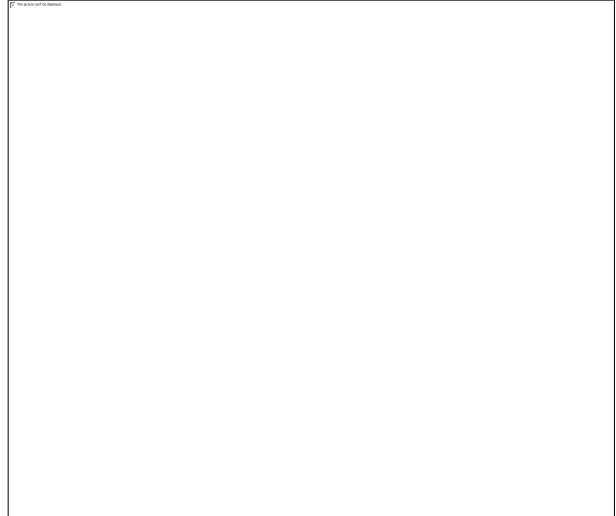
Crown of Grass HF | LF

Materials needed:

1. Crayons
2. Stapler
3. Scissors
4. Green Construction Paper
1. Stickers

Instructions:

1. Cut the piece of green construction in half.
1. Then snip the edge of one side of the paper to make grass. If you are concerned about cutting the paper all the way through, draw a line so that you will know where to stop.
1. You can continue to trim the edges to make it look more grass like. You can also add some color to make it look more realistic.
1. Once the grass is cut add stickers of summer critters, flowers, bugs, birds, and anything else you would like to decorate it with.
1. Then staple the two pieces to make one long strip. Size it to your head and staple the other ends together to finish the crown.



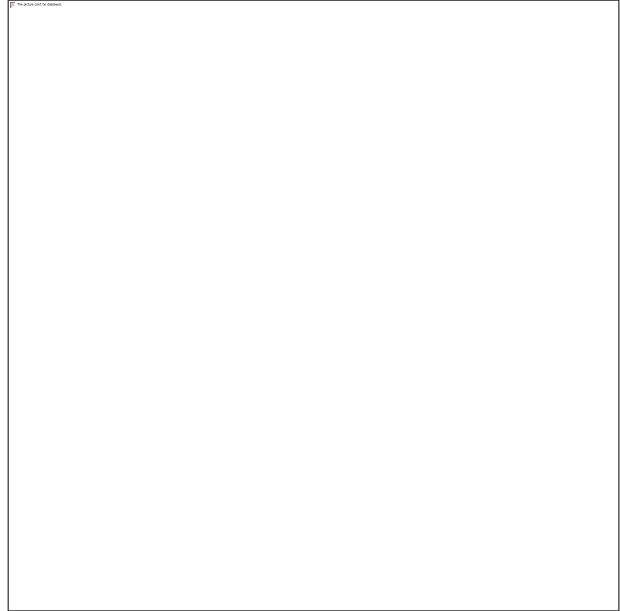
Cherry Blossom Windsock | HF

Materials needed:

1. Toilet Paper Roll
2. Construction Paper
3. Pink Tissue Paper
4. Scissors
5. Glue
1. Paint
2. Stapler

Instructions:

1. Paint your toilet paper roll light blue. Let it dry.
1. Then paint some brown branches over the blue. Let it dry.
1. Cut several streamers of pink tissue paper. Glue or staple them to the bottom of your TP roll.
1. Cut several squares of pink tissue paper. Scrunch them into a loose ball and glue them onto the branches. Continue scrunching up tissue paper squares and gluing them all over the cherry tree branches until it is full of cherry blossoms.
1. Cut a length of pink construction paper 1-inch by 8 1/2-inches. Add a generous amount of glue on one end of the paper strip and attach it inside the top of the windsock. Add glue on the opposite end of the paper strip and attach it to the opposite end of the windsock to create your handle.
1. Hang your windsock outside and watch it dance around in the spring wind. Or display the windsock indoors for a colorful spring decoration.



Spring Flower Craft | HF

Materials needed:

1. Paint
2. Q-Tips
3. Blue Paper

Instructions:

1. Paint the stocks and leaves with green paint.

1. Paint on black lines at the top of the stems for the dandelion centers. If

you want, you can also paint some tiny yellow dots on top of the black line to make them look more realistic.

1. Take 5 or 6 cotton buds and tape them together, or tie them together using an elastic band. Now you have a bundle of cotton buds that you can print with.

1. Dip your tied cotton buds into white paint. Press them down and lift straight up off the paper to avoid smudging. Make these prints all the way round the dandelion center

1. As an added touch, you can pick a dandelion which has some seeds blowing off in the wind. To do this you still print all the way around the center but you then leave a small gap at the top.

1. Take a single cotton bud and print a little line of dots floating away from your dandelion.

That way you can make it look like some dandelion seeds are blowing off in the breeze.



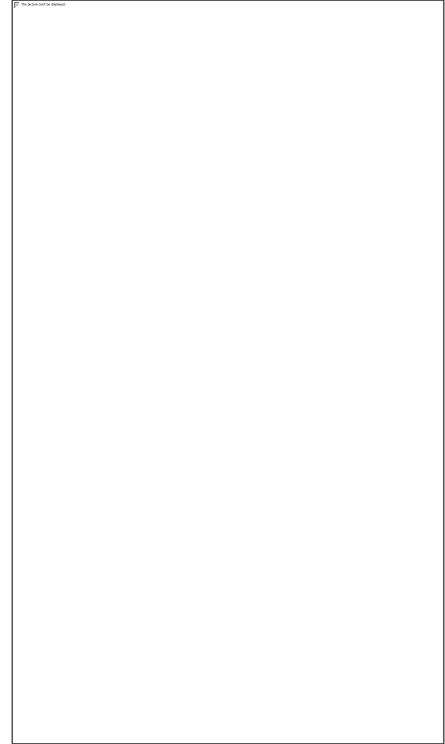
Soda Tab Flower Art | HF

Materials needed:

1. Soda Tabs
2. Paint
3. Markers
4. Paper

Instructions:

1. Paint some tabs whatever color you want your flowers to be
1. Glue them onto the paper in the shape of a flower
1. Paint the middle of the flower and yellow circle
1. Use a marker to add a stem and leaves to each of your tab flowers
1. Now add whatever extra details you like (ex. Sun, grass, or birds)



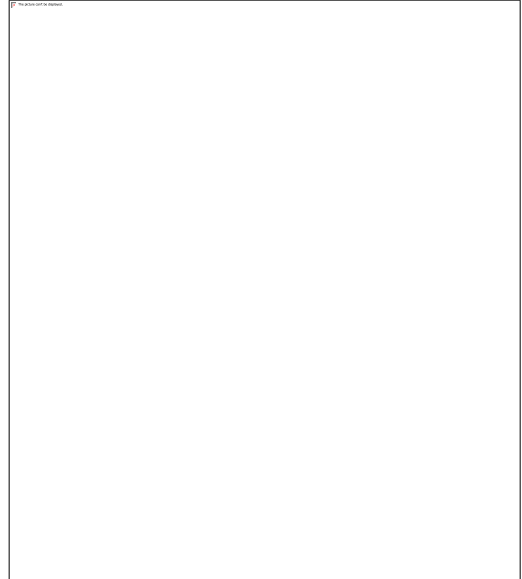
Paper Plate Sunflower | LF

Materials needed:

1. Yellow Tissue Paper
1. Paper Plate
2. Black Marker
3. Yellow Construction Paper
4. Scissors
5. Glue

Instructions:

1. First cut your yellow tissue paper into small squares. Set them aside.
1. Next, cut out your sunflower petals from the yellow cardstock.
1. Take your petals and staple them to the outside rim of the paper plate. {Trust me – do this first!}
1. Now slather a good amount of glue all over the inside of the plate and cover the paper plate with the tissue paper squares.
1. Once completely covered, use the black marker or black paint to make black dots on your plate for the seeds.



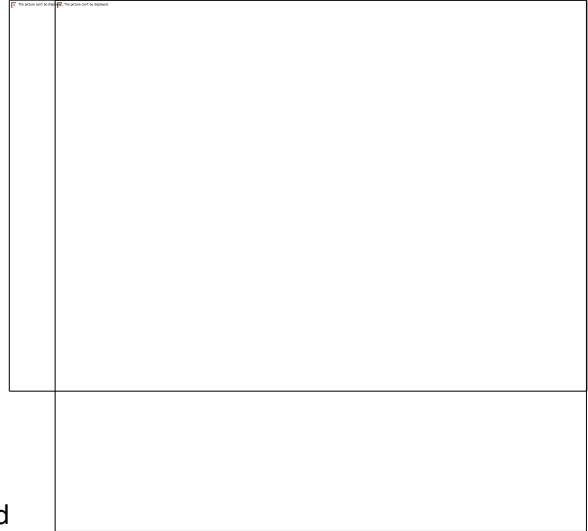
Spring Paper Tree Craft | HF

Materials needed:

1. Construction Paper
1. Glue
2. Scissors

Instructions:

1. Cut out a rectangle from your light green cardstock for grass. Glue it onto the bottom of your light blue cardstock. Then cut out a tree trunk and branches from your brown cardstock and glue them onto your light blue cardstock.
1. Use a paper cutter to cut out strips of pink, dark pink and light green cardstock that are 3/4-inch by 4 1/4-inches. You'll need anywhere from 40-50 of these paper strips.
1. Use your glue stick to add some glue to the end of a paper strip and then fold it into a circle, gluing the two ends together. Continue folding and gluing all of the paper strips into circles.
1. Add a dot of glue onto the bottom of a paper circle and then glue it onto the branches of your spring tree. Continue adding glue to each paper circle and then glue them around all of the branches of the spring paper tree craft.
1. Once you have filled up your spring paper tree craft with paper circles, allow the glue to dry completely.



Coiled Snake Art Project | HF | LF

Materials needed:

1. Markers or paints
 2. Stapler, Glue, or Tape
 3. Strips of colored construction paper (ours are 1.5"x12")
 4. Hole Punch
 5. Pipe Cleaners
1. Pencil
 2. Green Construction Paper

Instructions:

1. Start by making the snail's head. Fold a small piece of the paper strip under and secure it in place with stapler, glue, or tape. This will create a small loop for the snail's head.
1. Time to decorate your snail's shell! You can color the top of the paper (inside of the shell), as well as the bottom of the paper strip (outside of the shell). Make your snail as colorful as you like!
1. Once your snail is all decorated, you can start coiling the paper into a shell. With the snail right-side-up, lay a pencil on top of the paper strip and roll the paper around it.
1. The finishing touch for your snail is a pair of tentacles. Punch two small holes in the top of the head loop. Thread a piece of pipe cleaner, about 3" long, down and up through the holes. Adjust and curl the pipe cleaner tentacles. What a cute little pet snail that you won't mind creeping around your plants!

Cactus Pet Rocks | HF

Materials needed:

1. Rocks
2. Mini Clay Pots
3. Paint
4. Googly Eyes
1. Glue

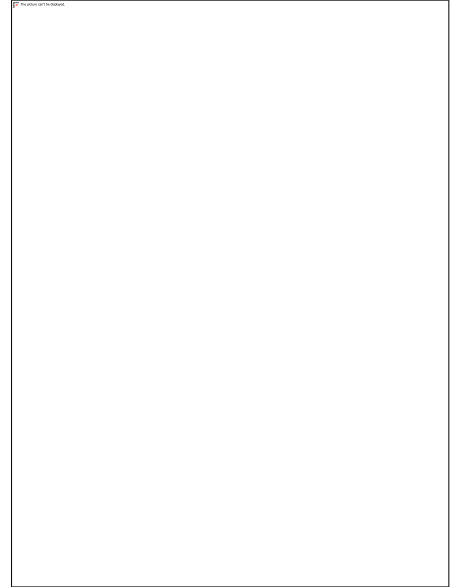
Instructions:

1. Paint your rock green

1. Use white paint to add accents to make it look like a cactus

1. Once the paint is dry, glue some googly eyes to your rock.

1. Finally, glue the rock into the mini pot



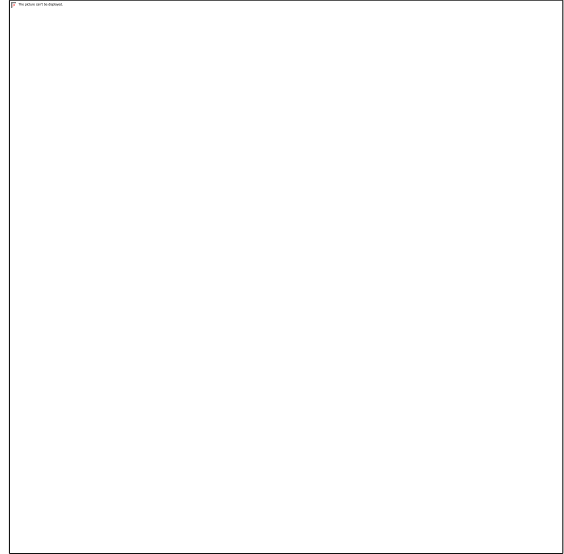
Bottlecap Printed Hyacinth | LF | HF

Materials needed:

1. Blue and Green Cardstock
2. Purple Paint
3. Water Bottle Cap
4. Glue
5. Scissors
1. Small Paper Plate

Instructions:

1. Cut out skinny green stems and glue them onto your light blue cardstock paper.
1. Pour some purple paint onto your small paper plate. Dip your water bottle lid into the paint and then print it onto your blue cardstock paper, around your green flower stems. Continue dipping the water bottle lid into the paint and back onto your paper until you have made your hyacinth flowers.
1. You can leave the beautiful artwork as is or after your paint is dry, you can cut out some leaves from your green cardstock paper and glue them onto the sides of your Hyacinth flowers.



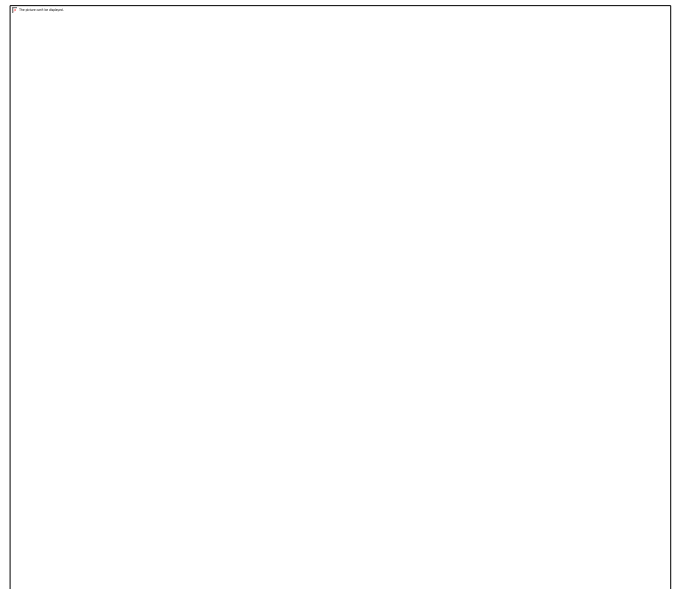
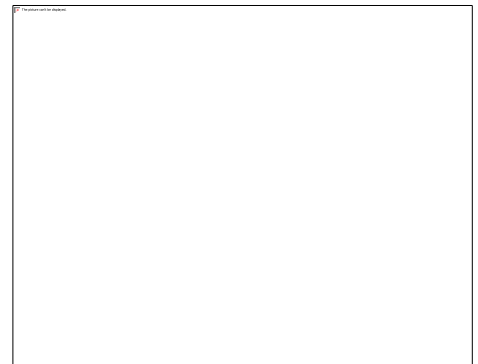
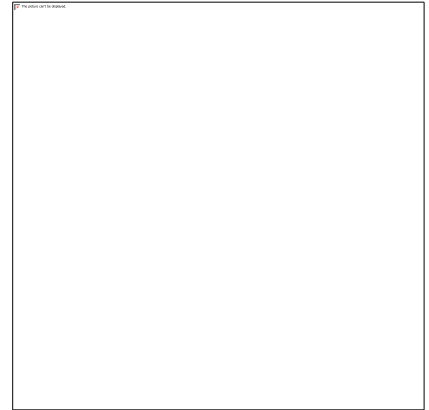
Paper Bag Stars | LF | HF

Materials needed:

1. Paper Bags
2. Scissors
1. Glue

Instructions:

1. Glue 7 paper bags together right on top of each other
1. Cut out a V shape there the bags open
1. Cut a small triangle on each side
1. Unfold and admire your beautiful art project!



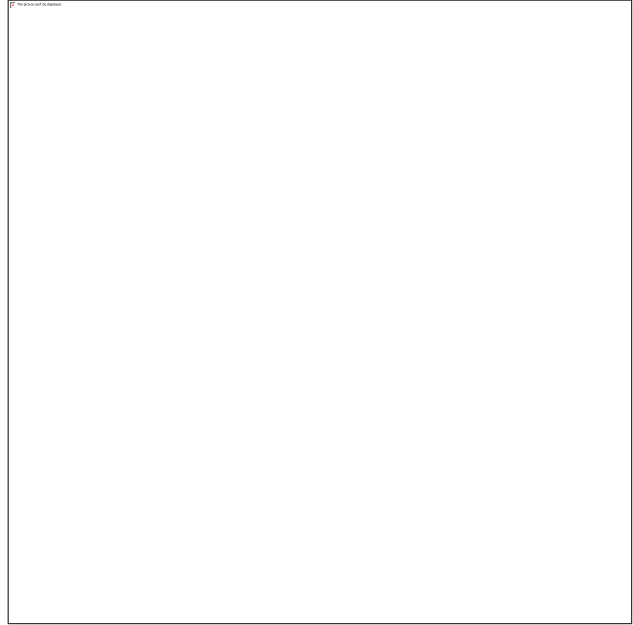
Paper Plate Koala | LF | HF

Materials needed:

1. Regular Paper Plate
2. 2 Small Paper Plates
3. Gray Paint
4. Black Marker
5. Black Paper
1. White Paper
2. Glue

Instructions:

1. Start by painting all three of your paper plates gray. While the paint is drying cut an oval shape out of the black paper for the nose.
1. Once your plates are dry, staple the two smaller plates onto the large plate to make ears. Press along the middle circle of the small plates so they curve upward instead of down. Then cut slits along the bottom of the ears so it looks like hair.
1. Now cut two small circles out of the white paper. Use a black marker to make the pupils. (If you have googly eyes you can just use those instead)
1. Glue the eyes and nose on the face of the koala.
1. Use black marker to draw a mouth



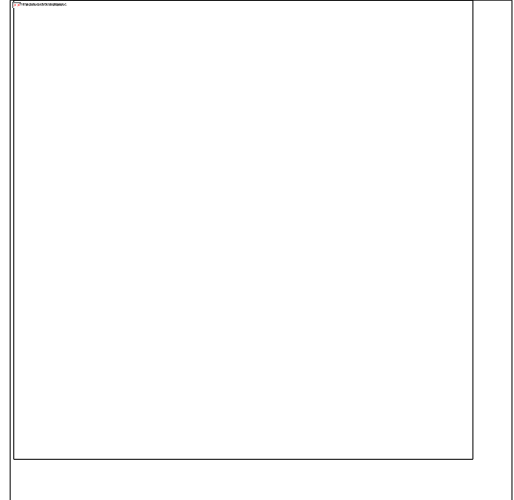
Swimming Jellyfish Craft | HF

Materials needed:

1. Paper Plate
2. Paint
3. Cardboard
1. Colorful Yarn
2. Googly Eyes
3. Craft Popsicle Stick
4. Glue
5. Scissors

Instructions:

1. Gather your materials. Draw the shape of a jellyfish body on your small piece of cardboard and cut it out. Paint the piece with your pink paint, or whatever color you want your jellyfish to be. Set it aside to dry.
1. Paint the top of your paper plate (the side you eat on) with blue paint and paint your craft stick with blue paint. Set them aside to dry.
1. When your paper plate is dry, have an adult carefully cut a slit in the paper plate about 2/3 down the plate. This is the slit for your jellyfish.
1. Turn your jellyfish body over and add a line of glue at the bottom. Cut several strands of colorful yarn and place them down on the glue. These are your jellyfish tentacles. Turn your swimming jellyfish craft over and glue two googly eyes on it. Let the jellyfish craft dry completely before playing with it.
1. To make your jellyfish swim, place the craft down inside the slit in your paper plate. Hold the stick from behind the paper plate with one hand while stabilizing the paper plate with your other hand. When you move around the craft stick behind the paper plate your jellyfish swims around and around. Fun, right?!



Paper Plate Sewing Sun Project | HF

Materials needed:

1. Yellow Paper Plate (or you can paint a plate yellow)
2. Yellow Paper
3. Yellow Yarn
1. Hole Punch
2. Glue

Instructions:

1. Begin by drawing (or tracing) a circle on the back of your paper plate. Poke a hole into the circle with your scissors and then cut out the circle.

1. Use a hole punch to punch holes around the entire perimeter of the circle about 1/2-inch to 1-inch apart.

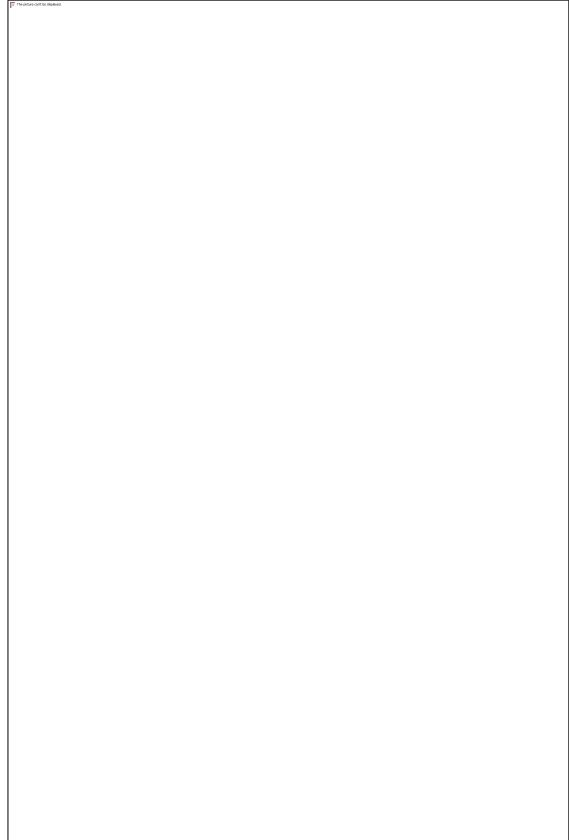
1. Tape the end of the yarn onto the back of the paper plate.

1. Now begin sewing around the holes in the paper plate. Come up through a hole in the back of the paper plate to start, then go back down through a hole at the front of the paper plate. Continue this process, sewing through each of the holes in the paper plate.

1. The longer the strand of the yarn the better so you'll fill up more of the spaces inside the circle. If you reach the end of your yarn and still want to sew more, cut off another long strand of yarn, tie it to the existing yarn on your paper plate

1. After you have sewn through all of the holes in the paper plate, you can add orange and yellow pony beads onto each of the stitches you make. This adds fun texture and color to your sewing craft. When you reach the end of your yarn, tape the end of the yarn onto the back of the paper plate.

1. Cut yellow triangles out of your construction paper for sun rays. Glue them onto the back of the paper plate along the outside rim of the plate.



Paper Plate Dinosaur | LF

Materials needed:

1. Paper Plate
2. Paint
3. Clothes Pins
4. Paper
5. Scissors
1. Glue
2. Markers
3. Googly Eyes

Instructions:

1. Start by cutting your paper plate in half.
1. Decide what color body you want your dinosaur to have and paint one of the 1/2 plate pieces. Paint two corresponding clothespins for each dinosaur you want to make.
1. Once your dino body is dry, use it as a template for drawing your dinosaurs spikes, head, and tail. You decided if you want a long neck, short neck, small tail or long tail!
1. Glue your head, tail, and spikes to the back side of the paper plate.
1. Add a little smile and googly eye to your dino head.
1. Add clothes pins for legs and you're done!
